-Your point of view may be extremely obvious OR it may be obscured and be able to be read multiple ways

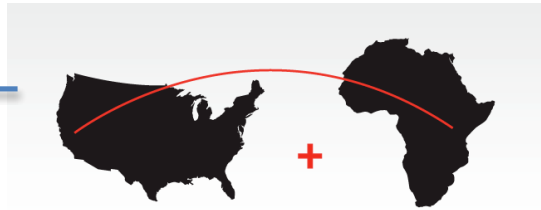
The specific proposal for your project should be something you feel strongly about or connected to

MIXED MEDIA POSTER CAMPAIGN. 1-2 PERSONS WILL CREATE:

-an 11x17 inch art poster illustrating an idea/fact that will create awareness for **IC** using mixed-media collage style including images, stencil or block printing.

-The individual's art will be posted around campus.



“ZINE”

UP TO 2 PEOPLE WILL CREATE:

-a 5.5x8.5 inch zine (pronounced “zeen”), a “do-it-yourself” style pamphlet exposing truths and spreading the word about the **IC** movement.

-You and your partner will create a cut-and paste layout, using various materials like type, stamps, handwritten notes, bits of paper, images from the web or magazines.

-Your collaborative Zine will be photocopied and distributed around campus.

PACKING TAPE SCULPTURE 2-3 PEOPLE WILL CREATE

-a large-scale figure made out of packing tape that explores an idea from the IC movement.

-The impressive full-body sculptures will be conceptual, complete with an “artist’s statement” and will be installed around campus to raise awareness for Uganda.
